Description

Phil will take you through foundation drawing techniques based on 19th century European atelier practice to train your eye for creating realistic drawings using the Bargue method.

This teaching model was widely used in the French Academy in the 19th and early-20th centuries. By copying instructional images, the student learns to improve observational skill and break down visual information into form, shadow and light.

Using Bargue drawings and sight-size methods you will learn how to set up your environment, use different pencil holding techniques and various measuring techniques to train your eye for more realistic drawings. You will work from a life model in the afternoon.
